There is a 3 strike policy—a warning in writing will be given after each offense when a parent/guardian is more than 10 minutes late picking up their child. After the 3rd strike, a \$1.00 per minute fee will be assessed the next time the parent or guardian is late. That fee must be paid prior to the participant being admitted to the next class.
