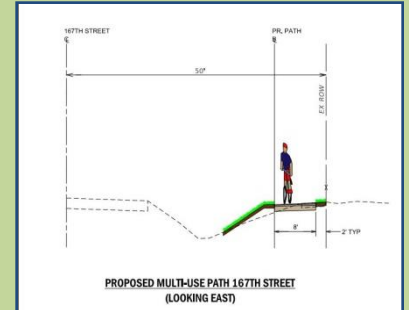

INTRODUCTION

The Village of Orland Park is currently engaged in preliminary engineering and environmental studies (Phase I) for the south side of the 167th Street corridor, between Steeplechase Parkway and 104th Avenue to implement an 8-foot wide multi-use path. The new path is aligned with the Village's Regional Bike Plan. Currently, there are intermittent sidewalks located within the project limits.



PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS CONSIST OF:

- 8-foot wide asphalt path
- Culvert extension
- Retaining wall
- Pedestrian push-buttons and signals
- New ADA-compliant crossing over the Metra Southwest Service Line railroad with pedestrian railroad gates

NEXT STEPS AND FUNDING

At this time, no funding is programmed and a construction schedule has not been established. The Village intends to apply for an ITEP grant this fall for both Phases II and III and construction. The anticipated construction cost is \$2.5 million.
